The Protection Officer will also oversee protection mainstreaming across all Oxfam programmes including WASH and EFSVL, and have input into future projects with protection recommendations, and safe programming, as well as implement a cash for protection programme for vulnerable and at risk families.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Participates in developing and updating the mapping of services for threats and abuses (including GBV) that IDPs and returnees face, in Oxfam areas of operation.
- Creates referral pathways from service mapping and creates awareness in the community around access.
- Conducts assessments on vulnerable families and needs to determine eligibility of cash for protection assistance.
- Monitors protection issues affecting IDPs and host population in areas of operation.
- Conducts surveys, focus groups, and awareness raising sessions on protection issues.
- Organises and facilitates community dialogues and platforms of advocacy so affected communities have a voice and can express their needs and challenges to the duty bearers.
- Facilitates community consultancy groups to ensure participation in feedback on Oxfam programming.
- Participates in training, capacity-building, and technical support to ensure Oxfam approach to protection is implemented effectively and in line with key standards and principles.
- Prepares written protection updates for Oxfam situation reports.
- Co-ordinates community consultations and orientation sessions about IDP rights, entitlements, registration, basic and specialist services in the districts.
 - Works with local partners to conduct community based orientation sessions working with counterpart in partner organisation where possible.
 - Coordinates activities with WASH and EFSVL teams to ensure integration of protection in programme activities and ensures safe programming throughout Oxfam activities.
 - Provides written feedback about protection incidents, issues and aid-related community-conflicts
 Ensures gender sensitive approach is taken to programming and integrated into protection assessments and activities.
